

Bartholomew Estate Winery has reopened its art gallery with a permanent exhibit of artists who take part in the Sonoma Plein Air festival. The gallery is located within the property's historic Mission-style winery building.

"We are delighted to be back open and to donate this space to the Sonoma Plein Air Foundation to share their wonderful rotating exhibit of works by their artists. It supports our mission of giving back to the community," said Anna Pope, winery co-owner and trustee of the Frank H. Bartholomew Foundation, which owns and operates the nonprofit Bartholomew Park, in the announcement of the reopening.

Sonoma Plein Air donates 25 percent of its proceeds from art sales to support art education in local schools and community organizations.
