Bartholomew Estate Winery has unveiled a new partnership with Spread Kitchen to keep customers satiated while tasting wines.

Called The Spread at Bart Estate, the offering includes a three-course menu of Eastern Mediterranean fare from Spread chef/owner Cristina Topham, all beautifully presented in a three-tier tiffin and paired with a two-glass flight of Bartholomew Estate wines. Current menu items include shawarma, falafels, tabbouleh, stuffed grape leaves, pita with dips and desserts. Guests can choose from a selection of wines including rosé of zinfandel, sauvignon blanc and zinfandel from the historically significant estate.

With its first vineyard planted in 1832, the Bartholomew Estate Winery is a storied site. It served as Sonoma Valley’s primary community hospital from 1922 until 1957, and then as a working winery for the Bartholomews. Bartholomew Estate Winery opened its doors on April 27, 2019, founded by Anna Pope, a trustee of the Frank H. Bartholomew Foundation, and winemaker Kevin Holt, to honor the legacy of Frank and Antonia Bartholomew.

In 1943, the Bartholomews purchased the property at auction, only to discover that it was the birthplace of California viticulture, the center of Count Agoston Harazthy’s Rancho Buena Vista that contained his residence, original winery and vineyards.

The Frank H. Bartholomew Foundation was created to preserve and protect the historic site in perpetuity. Bartholomew Park opened in 1990 and all profits from wine sales support the park.
